- 1) Lottery Incentives (S1059): Sponsor: State Lottery Commission: Increase incentive bonus to retailers for lottery ticket sales volumes and other objectives. Idaho Conservative Position: No. Passed 19-14
- 2) Day Care Regulation (S1112): Sponsor: Sen. Tim Corder (R-22): Expand day care regulations to day cares with as few as four children. Idaho Conservative Position: No. Passed 30-5
- 3) Employee Free Choice Act (SJM102): Senator John McGee (R-10): Employee Free Choice Act: Findings of the legislature urging congressional delegation to oppose the Employee Free Choice Act. Idaho Conservative Position: Yes. Passed 27-7.
- 4) Removing Incentives for School De-Consolidation (S1159): Saves taxpayers money by revising portions of state law that incentivize the creation of new school districts. Sponsor: Sen. John Goedde (R-4) Idaho Conservative Position: Yes. Passed 23-10.
- 5) Education Funding (H0252): Sponsor: Rep. Bob Nonini (R-5):: Allows school boards to suspend certain provisions of state law including those relating to teacher pay during a financial emergency. Idaho Conservative Position: Yes. Passed 26-8
- 6) Confirmation of Ruth Johnson to Human Rights Commission: Motion by Senator Mike Jorgenson (R-3): Liberals opposed her nomination due to her opposition to adding sexual orientation to Human Rights laws. Idaho Conservative Position on Johnson: Yes. Passed 28-7.
- 7) GARVEE Bonds (S1186): Authorizes the sales of \$82 million in Garvee Bonds, thus reducing the amount of federal money available for road maintenance in future years. Idaho Conservative Position: No. Passed 28-6.
- 8) Gas Tax Increase (H0096a): Senate Amendment to H0196 would have increased the State Gasoline Tax by six cents over 2 years. Idaho Conservative Position: No. Passed 21-14
- 9) Employee Fire Arms Storage (H0287): Sponsor: Rep. Jeff Thompson (R-33) Provides an immunity for employers when allowing employee firearm storage in personal vehicles on the employer's business property. Idaho Conservative Position: Yes Passed 26-8
- 10) Election Consolidation (H0372): Sponsor: Rep. Dennis Lake (R-28) Limit elections to four days a year. Idaho Conservative Position: Yes. Passed 27-8
- 11) Transportation Funding (H0226): Sponsor: Rep. Marv Hagedorn (R-20): Innovative transportation funding proposal to increase transportation funding without raising taxes by allow Idaho to compete for business selling permanent plates to shipping companies. Passed 26-7.
- 12) Virtual Instruction (H0374): Sponsor: Rep. Bob Nonini (R-5): Allows school districts to offer virtual instruction, opening the door to potential tax savings and modernization. Idaho Conservative Position: Yes. Passed 23-9
