- 1) Education Mastery Advancement Pilot (H0493): To create a pilot program to allow early graduation by qualifying students at a savings to Idaho Taxpayers. Sponsor: Rep. Steven Thayn (R-11). Idaho Conservative Position: Yes Passed 61-7
- 2) Idaho Health Freedom Act (H0391): Codifies as State Policy that “every person in the State of Idaho is and shall continue to be free from government compulsion in the selection of Health Insurance Options.” Sponsor: Rep. Jim Clark (R-3) Idaho Conservative Position: Yes Passed 52-18
- 3) Sovereignty Under the Tenth Amendment (HCR044): A resolution calling for the federal government to: 1) balance the federal budget, 2) pay off the federal debt, 3) prevent unfunded mandates, 4) refrain from taking over private enterprises, and 5) to provide for the presence of God in the public domain. Sponsor: Rep. Rick Jarvis (R-21) Idaho Conservative Position: Yes Passed 50-17

- 4) Airport Debt (HJR005): Allows “political subdivisions and regional airport authorities operating an airport to incur debt without voter approval.” Idaho Conservative Position: No Passed 57-12
- 5) Hunter Privacy (H0531): To “to provide for the confidentiality of certain fish and game records; to prohibit harassment, intimidation and threats relating to the lawful taking and control of fish and wildlife;” Idaho Conservative Position: Yes Passed 55-14.
- 6) Local Improvement Districts (H0616): Provides that “When a Local Improvement District is initiated by a resolution of the council, bonds, registered warrants or interim warrants in an amount of \$500,000 or more must be approved by vote or petition.” Sponsors: Rep. Raul Labrador (R-14) Passed 42-23 Idaho Conservative Position: Yes
- 7) Firearms Freedom Act (H0589): “This bill states that firearms and ammunition manufactured in the state of Idaho using parts manufactured in the state of Idaho will be exempt from federal law or federal regulations, including registration, firearms accessories, or ammunition that is manufactured in Idaho and remains in Idaho under the authority of the United States Congress to regulate interstate commerce.” Sponsor Rep. Dick Harwood. Passed 52-17 Idaho Conservative Position: Yes
- 8) Freedom of Conscience for Health Care Professionals (S1353): Sponsor: Senator Chuck Winder (R-14) to provide conscience clause protections to medical professionals in relation to abortion and end of life care. Passed 51-18 Idaho Conservative Position: Yes.
- 9) Random Drug Tests on Welfare Recipients (HCR055): Sponsor: Rep. Rick Wills (R-22): Requests the Department of Health and Welfare to study the costs of introducing random drug testing to those on public assistance. Passed 55-11 Idaho Conservative Position: Yes
- 10) Constitution (HCR064): Urges changes to the Constitution to restore the tenth Amendment and limit Congress’ power under the commerce clause. Sponsor: Rep. Ken Roberts (R-8) Passed 46-16. Idaho Conservative position: Yes.
- 11) Transparency (H0699): Requires school and other education providers to create a searchable website with expenditures and revenues. Sponsor: Rep. Phil Hart (R-3) Passed 54-12. Idaho Conservative Position: Yes.
- 12) GARVEE Bonding (S1427): Has the state borrow \$12 million more against future gas tax receipts to finance road projects. Passed 45-24 Idaho Conservative Position: No
